### **DATES & DEADLINES**

- May 1: USMLE Step 1, Step 2 CK, Step 3 and COMLEX Level 1, Level 2 CE, Level 3 resumed at some Prometrics sites
- May 27: Access to VSAS/VSLO resumed
- June 8: ERAS 2021 Season begins
- July 1: COMLEX Level 2 PE testing plan to resume. [In May 2020, USMLE Step 2 CS was suspended for 12-18 months.]
- Sept. 1: Applicants may begin submitting ERAS applications to residency programs
- Oct. 21: Residency programs may begin reviewing ERAS applications & MSPEs released to residency programs
- March 3: NRMP Rank order list certification deadline
- March 15-18: NRMP Match Week & SOAP → Date is unchanged from previous years
- May 2021: Graduation!

### STATEMENTS, RECOMMENDATIONS, & GUIDELINES FOR 2021 EM APPLICANTS

Consensus Statement on the 2020-2021 Residency Application Process for U.S. Medical Students Planning Careers in Emergency Medicine In the Main Residency Match

Summary of the guidelines for EM-bound students:

- Complete 1 and only 1 EM rotation at an EM residency program.
  - Students with access to home EM rotations should not seek away rotation.
  - Students who lack access to home EM rotations should seek 1 away rotation.
- Only 1 EM clerkship SLOE is needed.
  - Students are encouraged to request from their other letter writers to use the Non-EM SLOE formatted letter
  - CORD & CDEM are working on this! Tentative release date is July 1.
- Accept 12 EM residency interviews ideally, with a max of 17 interviews.
  - All EM residency interviews will be virtual.

### Recommendations from the Coalition for Physician Accountability Work Group

Summary of the recommendations for the Class of 2021:

- · Recommendation 1: Away rotations for medical students are discouraged, except for:
  - Learners who have a specialty interest and do not have access to a home rotation in their school's system.
  - Learners for whom an away rotation is required for graduation or accreditation requirements.
  - Individuals meeting these exceptions should limit the number of away rotations as much as possible.
  - Students should consider geographically proximate programs, when appropriate, to meet learning needs.
- · Recommendation 2: All programs commit to online interviews and virtual visits for all applicants.
- Recommendation 3: Delay opening of ERAS & release of MSPE
- · Recommendation 4: All stakeholders provide transparency, regular communication, consistency, and equity.

### Creation of a SLOE for non-EM letter writers & Updated eSLOE format

(Tentative date for non-EM SLOE is July 1)

- What is a SLOE? → Standardized Letters of Evaluation
- · CORD & CDEM reasonable expectations for away rotations/SLOEs for EM-bound students
- · CORD created an e-SLOE committee, with plans to create a SLOE-like format for non-EM letter writers to use for this application cycle, to update the current e-SLOE format to reflect changes in light of the pandemic.
- For this reason, medical students should delay asking for narrative letters of recommendation from other specialties, so they can use the new templates.

- IRS Coronavirus Tax Relief and Economic Impact Payments
  - What is this?

Due to the hardships presented by the coronavirus, Stimulus Payments are being issued by the IRS.

- How much is the payment?

Up to \$1,200 for individuals or \$2,400 for married couples

- Eligibility: Non-Filers and Filers

### Non-Filers requirements:

- Have a Social Security Number
- Have not been claimed as a dependent on another person's 2019 tax return
- Have no income or have a 2019 gross income that is not more than \$12,200 (\$24,400 if married)

### If you meet these requirements, APPLY HERE.

Checks will be sent via direct deposit in approximately 3 weeks after submission.

### Filers requirements:

If you have already filed your 2018/2019 federal income tax return

• No further action is needed! You should have received/will receive the check soon.

If you are planning to file your 2019 Federal income tax return:

- Make sure you FILE & PAY your federal income taxes by July 15, electronically.
- You do not have to file any additional forms to qualify for the automatic Federal tax filing and payment relief.
  Unless there are other issues, you will likely be able to receive the check via direct deposit, as well. For more information, click here.
- How can I check on the status of my check? Click Get My Payment.
- Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act
  - What is this?

It is a federal law that provides automatic suspension of payments on student loans owned by the federal government and sets the interest rate at 0% from March 13 to September 30.

- What do I need to do to apply?

Nothing. Your federal student loan servicer will suspend all interest & payments.
